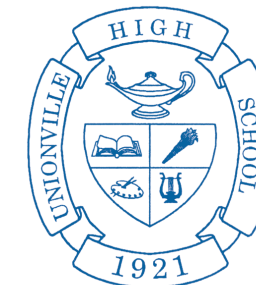

SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY FACTS

- School Enrollment: 1380, in grades 9-12.
- Unionville High School (UHS) is a co-ed public school established in 1921.
- UHS is accredited by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
- In addition to the rigorous academic courses provided, UHS offers students 18 AP courses, 17 honors courses, independent study, work experience, vocational/technical training, and Immaculata University dual enrollment courses.
- Numerous school and community extracurricular activities are offered.
- Located in the heart of the historic Brandywine Valley in southeastern Pennsylvania, students benefit from the close proximity of Philadelphia, PA and Wilmington, DE.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Each student must earn a minimum of 22 credits in grades 9-12 and complete a graduation project to graduate from UHS. Courses are offered on a year long or semester basis, with grades being reported quarterly.

CLASS RANK

GPA is calculated using a weighted 4.0 scale. For school year 2007-2008, advanced placement and honors courses were weighted by adding quality points to the final grade. One quality point is added for advanced placement courses and .50 quality point is added for honor courses. Prior to the 2007-2008 school year, advanced placement and honors courses were weighted by a factor of 1.25 times the numerical value of the letter grade. Class rank is reported by decile. The distribution of cumulative GPA by decile for the 338 students of the Class of 2009 is as follows:

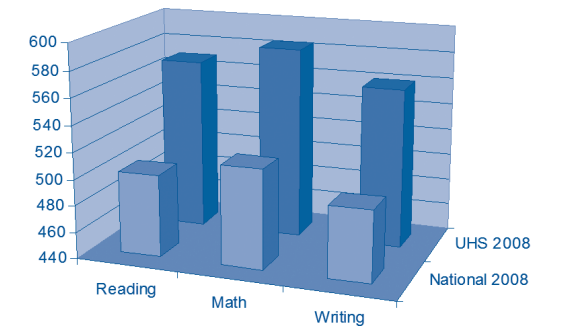

STANDARDIZED TEST RESULTS

- 94.3% of the Class of 2008 took the SAT I. Average scores were 570 for critical reading/verbal, 585 for math, and 561 for writing.
- 93.9% of the Class of 2007 took the SAT I. Average scores were 556 for critical reading/verbal, 572 for math, and 545 for writing.
- 87.0% of the Class of 2006 took the SAT I. Average scores were 572 for critical reading/verbal, 585 for math, and 554 for writing.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT

- Our AP offerings are usually limited to 11th and 12th grade students.
- The total number of AP courses taken is restricted due to the constraints of scheduling.
- The average number of AP courses students in the top 10% take in their high school career is 6.
- 85% earned a 3+: 3 (26%); 4 (33%); 5 (26%).
- 62 students were designated as AP scholars.
